
- How an individual can identify his/her prominent abilities and skills that would lead them to a successful career.


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
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
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














Report on "Effective Communication is the way to Entrepreneurship"




Some worksheet were given to students for checking their attitudes towards entrepreneurship.



- 6. Students will learn Entrepreneurship through start up with the project.







Screen Grab during the session of Perspectives of IPR by Adv. Sanjay Kher (Guest Speaker)


















Report – Celebration IIC Activity


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
