Session II: Panel Discussion with CEOs Time: 10.30 am to 11.30 am



TiGroup Discussions (GD) and Personal Interviews (PI) are standard selection tools for entry into the corporate sector. While an aspirant's academic record, work experience (if any) and scores in the entrance test qualify him/her for an interview call, the final selection depends largely on his/her performance in the 'last mile.'

Therefore, a workshop has been designed to train the students on one of the important entry cards to an organization- Group Discussion. The workshop will be divided into two phases:

Phase I- Group Discussion/ Case Study

Round I:

An external Trainer will conduct the session with a group of students. 12 students will be selected for the Mock GD. The other students in the Auditorium will view the "Live GD/ Case Study" session to understand the Do's and Don'ts of a Formal Group Discussion. The Expert will give the topic and interpret their behavior, communication skills, team participation, analytical skills, leadership qualities, non-verbal communication, presence of mind, content, usage of content to present the ideas. The expert will simultaneously guide the group as well as the audience present about the essential elements of Group Discussion.

Round 2:

After one round of mock session with guidance from the expert, the second round of Group discussion/ Case Study would be conducted by implementing the guidelines which are explained in the first round. The role of the trainer would be passive and he would evaluate and select the best candidates out of the group.

Post the live session, there will be an open question and answer session for the audience.

Session IV: Networking with Industry Professionals

Networking becomes a priority in a job search strategy. Networking is a skill, not a talent. From a company standpoint, employees hired through referrals save the company money during the recruitment process. One cannot attend one networking event, meet one industry professional, ask for referral and wait for the industry job of one's dreams.

Astudent needs to start networking and investing in building relationships while one is still at the undergraduate level. Therefore, a student needs to start adding value to the professionals that a student connects with.


INDUSTRIAL VISIT 2019-20



Navneet Industries exports its products to foreign countries like China, African nations, etc. and many states within India. The Industry produces 57 qualities of paper, out of which platinum paper being their best.

Industry Info:

The Industry produces around 8lacs books per day. The working hours of the Industry are 8 hours and overtime of 6 more hours is allowed to workers. There are 600 employees in the Industry. The employees earn Rs.150 per day as their wages.

Procedure:

The Company has a shade or the Warehouse where they kept different types of paper rolls to be process. After the rolls were put on linomatic machine where lining of the papers were done. After the lining of papers were done, papers were cutted either manually or via machine which is operated by the employees. Binding of the papers is done by pining the books or by stitching the papers together. This procedure is done by the employees using the help of the machine. The finishing touch to the books are done using the machines which may be hazardous to use if not known by the employees. The last procedure is the packing done by the Industry to the books and which are exported in as well as outside India.

Visit to RBI Monetary Museum

Students of Bachelor of Management Studies of R.D. & S.H. National College & S.W.A. Science College visited the RBI Monetary Museum on Thursday 25th August, 2022. This visit was headed by our professors Ms Darshana Kamble and Ms Suman Dhanani under the guidance and support of BMS Coordinator, Dr Nikisha Kukreja.

The RBI Monetary Museum was established by the Reserve Bank of India in 2004 and was inaugurated by Hon'ble Former President of India Dr APJ Abdul Kalam.

Money is an intrinsic component of the cultural heritage of a country mirroring its socioeconomic history. India was one of the earliest issuers of coinage in the world and has been home to many-a-monetary experiments recorded in history.

The RBI Monetary Museum aims at documenting and preserving this heritage. The Museum proposes to put in place permanent, temporary and itinerant exhibits of the representative coinage of India, paper currency, gold bars as well as financial instruments and curiosities down the ages. It also aims at stimulating research and study on the evolution of money around the Indian Ocean Rim and disseminating information to the Public anent currency & finance.

Since we all know money is a lifeline for every human being. Money can help us purchase any resources, help in running our businesses. In ancient times there was no concept of money. People used the barter system but the barter system had many problems such as Lack of common measure of value, difficulties in storage of goods, problems in deferred payments, indivisibility of certain goods etc.

Money has come by Evolution and not by Revolution. We all know the basic functions of money that are medium of exchange and measure of value. The field visit gave us great knowledge as to how people in ancient times used first coins as money. The coins displayed in the monetary museum by RBI showed how every kingdom, states used different forms of coins in every era. The RBI has beautifully displayed coins of various kingdoms starting from BCE era till AD era which even include kingdoms of Maharashtra, Hyderabad, Kashmir, Mughal era etc.

The museum set up by RBI has a very organised and systematic display where the students got to know how the coins in ancient times used to look. The bank even displayed the paper currency, coins used during the Portuguese and British rule.

As per the RBI sources, the Government of India continued to issue currency notes till the Reserve Bank of India was established on 1st April, 1935. When the one-rupee note was reintroduced as a war time measure in August, 1940, it was issued by the Government of India with the status of a coin. The Government of India continued to issue Rupee one notes till 1994.

The museum did not just have coins and currencies but it also had old physical form certificates. In this digital era, as the students are also learning about shares, accounts debentures in the electronic form, it was very refreshing for the students to see preside certificates and also how accounting books backed becaute the day.

The visit to RBI Monetary Museum finally put an end to the student's curiosity. The museum has even displayed the old calculators which were used to the analysts for office use. The museum


The total 100 students attended the session. Feedback was taken at the end of of short interviews where students were asked about their experience. Mile were motivated to pursue CA course.



Antimicrobial activity of different samples on Aspergillus niger, Candida albicans, Escherichia coli, Pseudomonas aeruginosa

Preparation of Inoculum:

A loopful of culture was inoculated in suitable broth and incubated for 24 hours. The culture OD was adjusted to 0.5 McFarland standard in order to get 1.5×10^8 CFU/ml. The cell suspension was vortexed to homogeneity to give final density of 1×10^6 CFU/ml.

Test Summary:

Antimicrobial Activity Test - Disk diffusion testing

The experiment was carried out according to Kirby–Bauer method with slight modifications as per protocol provided. Sterile filter paper discs (Whattman No1) 6mm in diameter were soaked with 15μL of sample. Disk soaked with 15μL Methanol was a negative control. The disks were placed on previously inoculated plates and incubated at 37°C for 24–48hrs and 72hrs. The zone of inhibition was measured.

It was observed that samples show zone of inhibition after incubation indicating the presence of antibacterial activity. thus happens to have Antifungal and Antibacterial activity.

Samples DA3,DA4,DA5,DA6,DA7,DA8,DA9,DA10,DA11,DA12 show antibacterial activity.

Samples DA1, DA4, DA6, DA7, DA8, DA9, DA10, DA11, DA12 show antifungal activity.

Samples DA4,DA6,DA7,DA8,DA9,DA10,DA11,DA12 show zone of inhibition against both Fungal and Bacterial cultures.

Sample DA2 does not show any antifungal or antibacterial activity as the zone of inhibition was absent

Conclusion:

The suggested Disk diffusion testing method against the test cultures was found to be effective. The zone of inhibition for *Aspergillus Niger and Candida albican* was more as compared to *Escherichia coli*, and *Pseudomonas aeruginosa*. This suggests that most of the sample contain better antifungal agents.
