Beyond Campus Environment Promotion Activities

The college tries to sensitize its stakeholders and inculcate pro-environment behavior amongst the students through various activities. The programs range from motivational seminars, lecture, visits, hands on training, etc. which are conducted not only inside the college premises but beyond, reaching to the youth in the society. Various reputed organizations and NGOs come forward to support such program either monetarily or otherwise.

Some of the important activities in this area are enlisted here:

2018-19:

a. Citizen Science Activity:

Ind Bandra Bird Race, a five yearly bird survey activity, was conducted by The Nature Club supported by D. M. Harish Foundation, Mumbai on 25 & 26 January 2019 where 103 students from 30 colleges from around Mumbai documented 106 birds in and around 10 km radius of Bandra. Prior to the actual survey, students were trained on birding, videography and photography by renowned professionals in the respective areas. As an outcome of this survey, a film on “Birds around Bandra” and a Research poster on Bird assessment were created. The film is uploaded on YouTube platform for public viewing.

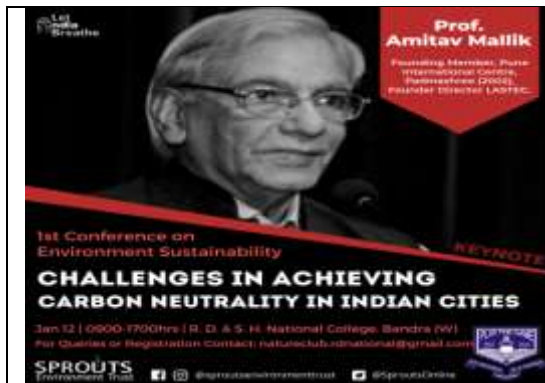

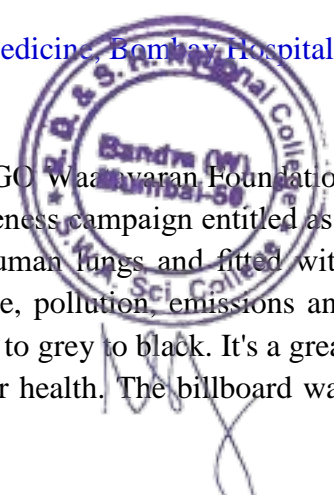
An Awareness Program on Impact of Air Pollution “Saaf Shwas 24 Taas”:Air Quality Campaign on 14 January 2020

Points to be Noted:

- (1) Bold red and bright yellow colour which is similar to Haldi and Kumukum, thus traditionally significant.
- (2) If we conserve this butterfly, deforestation will be eliminated in a wide variety of habitats including temperate hill forest, tropical rainforest and dry open woodland
- (3) This Butterfly is easily identifiable because Red and yellow color has the longest wavelength of any color on the visible spectrum .

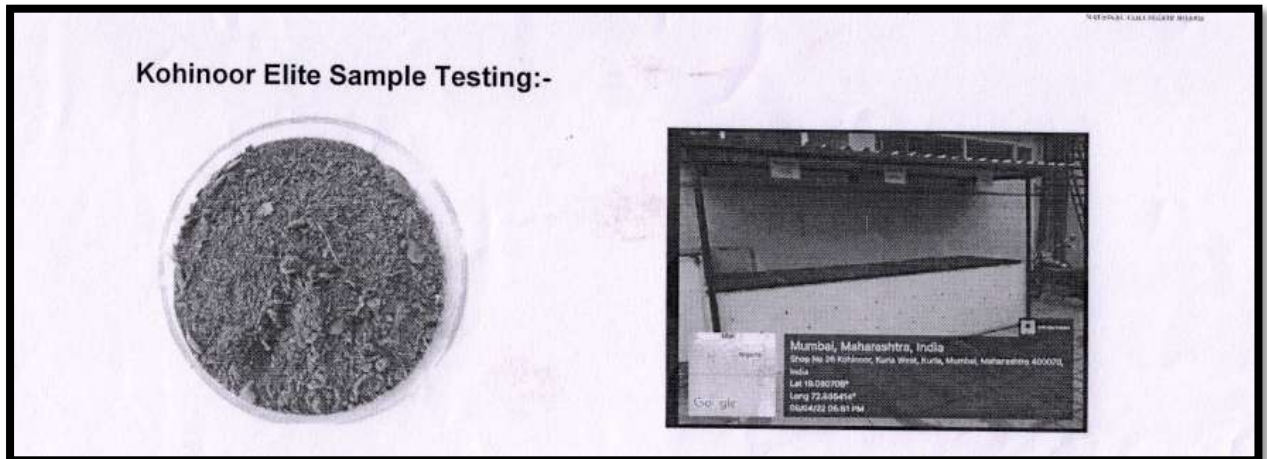

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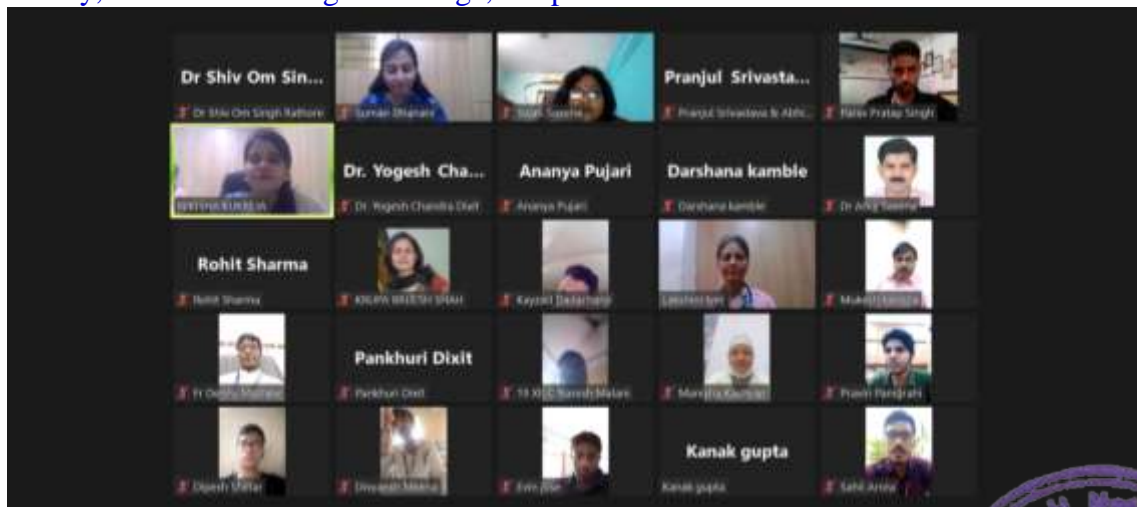

Using Energy Efficient Electrical Gadgets:

The College is committed to minimize the use of conventional energy and encourage the use of green and eco-friendly energy. As a step in this direction, the College has installed electrical devices, especially air-conditioners and refrigerators with star-rated energy saving devices.

Waste Management :Management of the various types of degradable waste management :

SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT FOR ZERO GARBAGE CAMPUS

Goals: To inculcate habits of cleanliness and hygiene among students, encourage them to convert garbage into an economic resource. Reduce, Reuse and Recycle garbage of our college and make our college campus "Zero Garbage Campus".

Waste Segregation:

- Creating awareness about segregation of dry waste (eg. Paper, plastic, metal, glass, ceramics, leather etc.) and Wet waste (eg. Cooked and uncooked food, waste from fruits, flowers, fallen leaves and other things).
- Different locations in the college campus were identified for setting up of "WET" and "DRY" garbage bins.
- Wet waste and dry waste is segregated by putting it in separate bins (Green bin for "WET" waste and Blue bin for "DRY" waste).
- The wet waste and dry waste from different location of college is collected separately at 8:30 am.
- E-waste is collected separately in black bins, from all laboratories and offices.
- Plastic bottles are collected separately by NSS volunteers for using it in Vegetable nursery garden project.

Composting Of Wet Waste :-

VERMICOMPOST UNIT:

- Wet waste, like leaves, garden waste, waste segregated from college campus (Green bin), uncooked food from canteen, waste from segregated wet waste bin is collected at 10 am by the students and the non-teaching staff.
- This wet waste is weighed and is subsequently put in vermicomposting units.
- The vermicompost harvested is distributed to teachers, students of our college and neighboring colleges or to anyone who requires it.

TUMBLER UNIT:

- Wet waste especially leftover cooked food etc. is collected by students and non-teaching staffs at 3:00 pm.
- The wet waste is weighed and subsequently put in the composting unit.
- Bacterial culture and saw dust is added to the tumbler composting unit for proper composting and odour free campus respectively.

Recycling of paper and dry waste :


- BMC authorized agency - Aara Welfare Association collects dry waste everyday at 8:30 am from college campus.
- Confidential papers are recycled by authorized BMC agency by shredding it in their warehouse.

Rhizophora apiculata Blume, Asiatic Mangrove (Rhizophoraceae) –An evergreen tree; distinguished by its acute leaf-tip, 2-flowered inflorescence, glabrous petal-lobes and 12 stamens of flowers. Its wood forms a potential source of tannin and finds application in plywood, adhesive, dye bark, cellophane, rayon, ferro-alloys, cellulose acetate industries and as a substitute for petroleum coke for calcium car-bide, besides being used as fuel-wood and in medicines; its leaves are used as fodder. The intricate stems with several still-roots are effective as tide breakers and check land run off and form an ideal niche for several faunal species. This tree is photographed at Nivti, Dist. 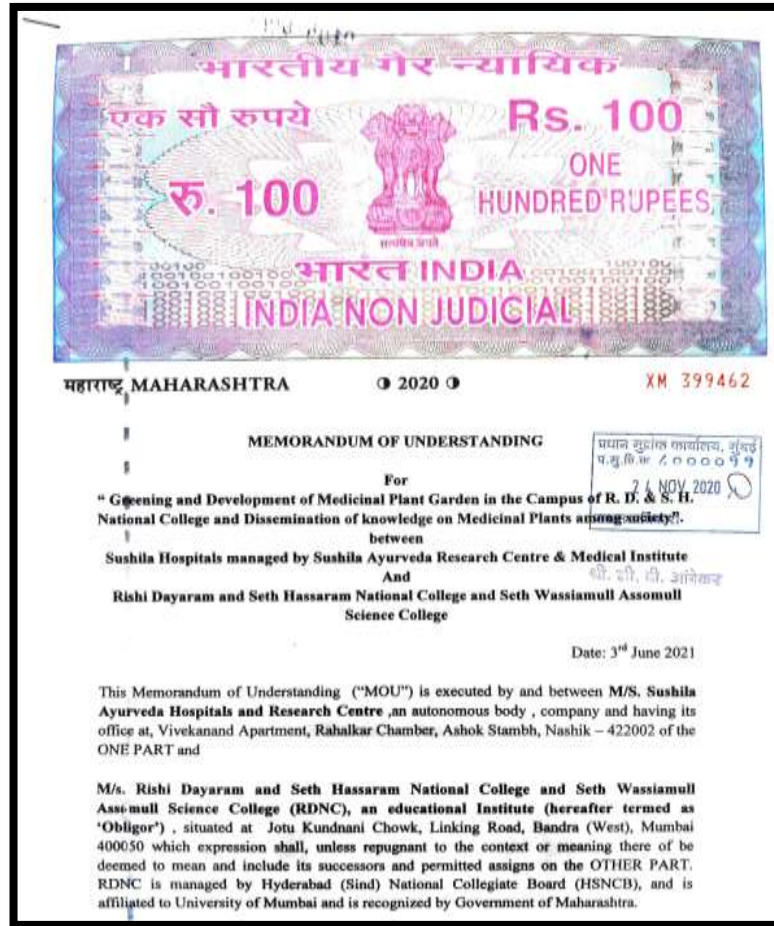
