Big Story: Celebrating Democracy week – "PRAJATANTRA"



'Prajatantra: The Democracy Week' is an academic festival, initiated by Praja Foundation, that celebrates democracy. It was organised by the faculty of Humanities of R. D & S. H. National College and S.W.A Science College, Bandra in association with Praja Foundation from 25th to 28th January, 2020.

The basic principle of a democratic life is that every citizen should participate actively in the political process and

governance. But over the years our society is losing the true essence of democracy, citizens have become reluctant to participate in democratic processes.

One of the building blocks of a person's participation in the democratic process has always been campus politics. Delhi, Kerala and West Bengal are known for their college campus politics. Maharashtra, having barred all forms of campus politics has resorted to learning about governance and democracy through academia for the past two decades. While this move has allowed students in colleges to get an understanding of the subject in theory, it has left the young adults, who have just entered voting age, to be blissfully unaware of the practical knowhow of democratic processes and this has given rise to a significantly low voter turnout in the state.

Thus, keeping this in mind, Praja Foundation started Prajatantra which is a celebration of democracy that, through a college festival, tries to impart knowledge and provide a safe haven for students to learn about various aspects of politics and its benefits. Through events like formation of the government, designing a state policy and parliamentary debate Praja Foundation tries to give the participants thorough knowledge and inform the students about the process and the importance of policymaking. Each event had its standalone aim and objective which aims to increase their understanding of the democratic system. The festival also tries to empower the students to participate in governance by providing knowledge and perspective.

Democracy Week – Prajatantra

With the desire to promote democracy, constitutionalism and good governance amongst the youth, Praja Foundation organises this annual event. To revive democracy and create new stories of participatory politics, **Democracy Week Festival** was organised in collaboration with Rishi Dayaram and Seth Hassaram National College and Seth Wassiamull Assomull Science College (R.D. National College) from **26th January, 2020 to 28th January, 2020**. This year the theme of Prajatantra was “**Formation of State Government**”.

The event was inaugurated by Chief Guest – Mr. Ameen Patel, MLA of Maharashtra Assembly, along with other dignitaries like Mr Jamal Mecklai, a member of the Board of Trustees for Praja Foundation and the CEO of Mecklai Financial, Ms Priyanka Sharma, Head of Capacity Building at Praja Foundation, Dr. Anil Singh and Dr. Neha Jagtyani. All the dignitaries laid down their perspective on democracy through their speech at the event. Followed by the inauguration session, was a cultural programme showcasing the vibrant culture of Maharashtra. More than 350 students, 25 teachers and volunteers participated in the event.

Prajantra Activities

- **Formation of Government – Chief Minister’s Speech**

In this competition, the participants were asked to form a state government and present their vision of the government through a Chief Minister’s speech. 14 different colleges from across the city participated in this competition. The students that participated formed their own political parties. The esteemed judges for the competition extolled the audacious visions of all teams.

- **Editorial Writing**

The topic given to the participants for the editorial writing competition was ‘Role of Youth in Rising Maharashtra’ and the theme was ‘Democracy and Governance’. The participants used exceptional writing skills and expressed their views and thoughts on the topic. This event also gave a chance to the participants to voice out their opinions. A total of 10 students participated in the editorial writing.

- **Poster Making Competition**

Another interesting topic was the Poster Making competition. This was conducted on the theme “Role of Youth in Rising Maharashtra” wherein participants focussed on issues of culture, society, religion, economy and agricultural crisis etc. The judges asked participants to venture and promote new ideas like cleanliness, sanitation, skill development etc. The posters that were created by the participants were unique with some funny quotes depicting the political situation that was prevailing at that period.

- **Quiz Contest**

The aim of the quiz contest was to stimulate the political and constitutional knowledge of the participants where the entire team could participate. The quiz competition was organised amongst the participating political parties to judge their general knowledge. There was a total of three rounds in the quiz competition with each round having an elimination and in the final round, there were two teams which had equal scoring at the end of the competition.

- **Treasure Hunt**

The treasure hunt was a fun game amongst all the events of the Prajantra. The participants were given chits with puzzles which they had to solve to proceed towards the other clues. The participants searched in the college campus for the answers to their clues. The team that came first completed the treasure hunt event in 20 minutes and the next team completed in 23 minutes. The main objective behind conducting this event was to test the participants’ quick thinking and decision-making abilities and inculcate the value of teamwork.

- **Panel Discussion**

The theme of the panel discussion was “The role of youth in emerging Maharashtra”. The topic assumed significance as the youth are the decision-makers of tomorrow, and therefore, they should be more involved in today’s governance. In the event, even the panellist laid down their viewpoint on democracy and youth participation.

- **Design a State level policy**

The organising team gave several options of ministries to the participants and told them to choose any one ministry and form a state-level policy accordingly. There were a total of 9 teams that participated in this event. The teams laid down policy presentation that included Policy objectives, policy vision and mission, policy target and implementation, policy budget etc. They explained one relevant policy under the aegis of each Ministry, such as the Ministry of Education, Ministry of Women and Child Welfare, Ministry of Finance.

- **Ms And Mr Democracy**

It was a personality contest to attract students and give them a chance to explore their democratic leadership and personality. It only had one round where the participants were judged on their leadership qualities, presence of mind and problem-solving abilities. Several question and answer sessions took place where the participants were asked their view point on democracy i.e., what they feel about democracy. To understand the participants' awareness of the various aspects of democracy, they were also given a certain situation where they had to narrate it with the solutions.

- **Guest Talks**

Mr Balasaheb Waghmare - The librarian and Resource Officer of Maharashtra Vidhan Bhavan library was the guest speaker who spoke on various facets of Maharashtra policy emphasising upon the importance of understanding the legislative and administrative procedures of the Maharashtra State Assembly in the context of the history in which these administrative policies were formed.

- **Parliamentary Debate Proposed Policies**

Based on participants' state policy presentation, a parliamentary debate competition was conducted. All the political parties had to debate amongst themselves over each other's proposed policies. Major debates rolled around housing policies like MHADA and SRA, free education for sex workers etc. Some political parties also focussed on youth's addiction towards technology and how can we encourage them to get involved in the governance system.

Closing ceremony

The closing ceremony started with the prize distribution to the winning teams. The winners of the competition were:

FACE-SHIELD MASKS AND DISTRIBUTION TO CLEANERS AND OTHER STAFF OF BMC IN BANDRA H/W/ WARD

- More than 20,000 BMC staff of cleaners and Garbage Collectors and other staff are performing out of their skin hard work, day and night, to maintain the cleanliness and hygienic environment in Mumbai.
- As one report published in TOI they are sweeping almost 2400 km roads and collecting approximately 4000 tonnes of garbage/waste every day.
- To express the solidarity of youth and students of Mumbai University with BMC staff, NSS unit R.D. and S.H. National College, Bandra (w) designed a full face cover, got it stitched and distributed these specially designed 500 face-cover masks for BMC staff of H/W ward Mumbai.



Education Support Program For Adopted Village Pansai

- Underprivileged village children specially from remote and tribal villages do not have internet facilities available and consequently they are largely ignored in ongoing online scheme of education.
- To circumvent the problem and address the educational concerns of Village adopted by NSS unit of our college a project entitled “CONTINUING EDUCATION THROUGH DIGITAL MEANS AT ADOPTED VILLAGE PANSAI” was envisioned by the Nationalite’s NSS wing. Since mobile phones are unavailable with children,
- A MI 42 screen size smart TV, with 15 GB uploading facility with proper enclosure, electricity connection was installed at Government Primary school on 13th September, 2020.
- Almost 500 lectures/animation videos (uploaded by philanthropic school teachers, Govt. Education Apps like Diksha etc) on various topics from Class -1 to Class 5 in covering entire syllabus in Marathi medium were uploaded on TV and a 32 GB pen drive with many other videos and supporting study material was provided.
- Few villagers and few bright students were trained on operation of TV. Now students can attend subject wise and class-wise sessions uploaded on this TV.
- Students were also provided with sufficient number of masks for their use. Time slots were also assigned to each class of school.



Diwali Support to adopted village BPL Families

- The impromptu lockdown and the days thereafter left BPL people with less paid jobs or no work at all.
- In such a scenario NSS recognised the pain and hardships of these economically challenged families residing in and around our adopted village- Pansai, Indapur, Mangaon , Raigad.
- In an effort to bring some hopefulness and positivity in their lives during the celebration of the largest Indian festival, Diwali, the NSS unit of R.D. and S.H. National College, Bandra west, Mumbai, provided a support basket with most of the basic necessities to ensure their chulhas burning and their children celebrating Diwali like most of us
- Total 29 Families were supported on Diwali

Community Kitchens at Dandpada ,Khar West & in Kherwadi, Bandra east

- NSS Volunteer organized one COMMUNITY KITCHEN for 200 people during COVID-19 outbreak in Khar West H/W/ward area. Volunteer Nikita Jain, Bcom was incharge of kitchen.This kitchen was conducted for 25 days and daily 200 packets were distributed in khar dandpada from 26 April to 19 May 2020 .
- One COMMUNITY KITCHEN was organized for 50 people during COVID-19 outbreak in Kherwadi, Bandra east area. This kitchen was conducted for 15 days and daily 50 packets were distributed to stranded labour from 1 May to 15 May 2020. Volunteer Aarti Bari was incharge of this kitchen



DISINFECTION OF RESIDENTIAL AREAS BY NSS VOLUNTEERS

A pilot project for disinfection of Residential Buildings and houses was successfully conducted by NSS unit of R.D. and S.H. National College was conducted.

- EPA and CDC suggested formulation was prepared and disinfection was carried out by volunteers in their respective residential building or localities.
- NSS Volunteers built their local teams in respective residential areas and carried out disinfection work with community youth participation.
- The objective was to make people aware on public participation for disinfection project.
- 22 NSS volunteers worked for the project and involved more than 50 Non NSS youth with them. It reduces a significant work burden of authorities and also significantly reduce the pathological bio-burden from environment.
- Almost 120 housing societies were covered in this pilot project. And a notable awareness was recorded in the people of respective residential areas.



Project Indradhanush

Pulse Polio Immunization in Covid period

- **NSS Unit of R.D. National College, Bandra (w)** extended support to Health department in Project Indradhanush on **31st January 2021**. An structured approach developed previously “NSS-BMC Pulse Polio joint Drive” for this project was followed.
- Total **56 Booths** of **H/w** and **Andheri region** were handled by almost **80 NSS volunteers** of RDNC – NSS Unit in H/W ward.
- More than **5000 children** were immunized by NSS volunteers, some more data is awaited.
- The above data depicts that the structured association of NSS with BMC proved to be very effective and volunteers could reach significantly high number of children for vaccination in this difficult time .

- In the ongoing Covid –19 regime the fitness becomes even more important. NSS Unit of R.D. National College, Bandra (w), organized a FIT INDIA PRABHAT PHERI PROJECT from 2nd December 2020 – 5th December 2020, each day Prabhat Feri was conducted in different areas of Juhu, Santacruz, Bandra region.
- NSS Volunteers used slogans to raise awareness about the importance of physical fitness. 25 NSS volunteers participated in the project. All Covid precautions were strictly followed during the activity.



Support to Senior Citizens: News from Hindustan Times

- Students from several colleges affiliated with the University of Mumbai (MU) have come to the rescue of citizens to combat fake news on social media.
- In one such instance, the volunteers of the National Service Scheme (NSS) from different colleges have been conducting awareness drives in societies. In the past few days, **NSS students from a Bandra college have made phone calls and appealed to at least 3,000 families around their college to follow safety measures and hygienic, and remain indoors over the next few days.**
- “The situation is getting scarier, especially for the elderly, who are unsure about whom to believe. So we are **providing them with data and information from government-officiated websites to prevent them from believing in fake news and information,**

What is INDIAN CONSTITUTION?

- The **Constitution of India** (IAST: Bhāratīya Saṃvidhāna) is the supreme law of **India**. The document lays down the framework demarcating fundamental political code, structure, procedures, powers, and duties of government institutions and sets out fundamental rights, directive principles, and the duties of citizens.

Fundamental Rights of the Indian Constitution



Defination

Fundamental rights are essential human rights that are offered to every citizen irrespective of caste, race, creed, place of birth, religion or gender. These are equal to freedoms and these rights are essential for **personal good** and the **society** at large

Six Fundamental rights

- The Right to **EQUALITY**
- The Right to **FREEDOM**
- The Right to Freedom from **EXPLOITATION**
- The Right to **FREEDOM OF RELIGION**
- **CULTURAL** and **EDUCATIONAL** Rights
- The right to **CONSTITUTIONAL REMEDIES**

Right to EQUALITY

- Article 14 of the constitution guarantees that all citizens shall be equally protected by the laws of the country .
- Article 15 states that no person shall be discriminated on basis of caste, gender ,etc.
- Article 17 abolishes practice of untouchability.



Right to FREEDOM

- The **Right to Freedom** is one of the Fundamental **Rights** guaranteed by the Constitution of India.
- The **right to freedom** gives citizens basic **freedom** with respect to speech and expression, form associations, **freedom** of personal liberty, **freedom** to live a life of dignity, etc.



Right against EXPLOITATION

- This Right has abolished human trafficking.
- Begar, practised in the past by the landlords, has been declared a crime & is punishable.
- Human trafficking for slave trade & prostitution is also punishable by law.
- Abolition of children below 14 yrs in dangerous jobs like mines & factories.



Right to FREEDOM of RELIGION

- According to the Constitution, all religions are equal before the State and no religion shall be given preference over the other.
- Citizens are free to practice any religion of their choice.
- No person shall be compelled to pay taxes for promotion of any particular religion.



CULTURAL and EDUCATIONAL Rights

- Article 26 states: "Everyone has the **right to education. Education** shall be free, at least in the elementary and fundamental stages".
- This Act casts a legal obligation on the state and central governments to execute the fundamental rights of a child (as per Article 21 A of the Constitution).



Right to CONSTITUTIONAL REMEDIES

- Right to constitutional remedies empowers the citizens to move to a court of law in case of any denial of the fundamental rights.
- The Supreme court as well as High court is given the powers to instill the fundamental rights.



Conclusion

- The Fundamental Rights and Fundamental duties of the citizens of India address freedom and democracy in the country, and the Directive Principles guides the Government in making laws and policies.
